HALL ACOUSTICS

Thank you for your patience while we come to a resolution with the hall acoustics. The process included a professional report from Autex Acoustics which came highly recommended to us. The report was then sent to their preferred installers in Whangarei and 3 quotes were returned. The Trust were very happy with the plan provided by MeasureUp, which also happened to be the most competitive quote. Quietspace panels will be installed on the ceiling throughout the dining and kitchen and we are advised this will make a huge difference. *Installers are set to start work on Wednesday 24th of July and will take 2 days - if you could please refrain from using the hall during this time - thank you.*

STORMWATER DRAIN

WDC have been working with geo technical engineers to work out a solution for the erosion issues and several plans are being investigated but with no decision made as yet. Unfortunately the original date of end of July has now been pushed out. WDC advises that factors involved in the decision include long term plan, funding, priority, disturbance and discharge into the estuary, working with regional council and local hapu etc. The Trust will do their best to keep you updated as soon as more information is at hand.

WATER UPDATE




