
I apologise to those that thought the email was spam! However it is completely optional and if you do not want to join the portal you can simply delete the email.

WATER NOTICE



We continue to urge Residents to be mindful of their usage and help preserve water.

Water-Saving Tips:

- Avoid tasks like water blasting or washing cars.
- When watering your garden, opt for the "soak, don't spray" method and water during the cool hours of the morning or evening to reduce evaporation.
- Consider catching shower water, sink or grey water for reuse.
- Only wash full loads in washing machines and dishwashers
- Consider extra containers to catch rain water for gardens
- And the old saying.. if it's brown flush it down if it's yellow let it mellow!
